



Is This Used Seat OK?

In the interest of child safety, several safety-related issues should be considered before selling a second-hand child restraint. Please review the following questions with the owner of the child restraint before agreeing to re-sell it.

1. Are any parts (including labels) missing or broken? Check the seat's instruction booklet to know for sure. If the instruction booklet is missing, call the manufacturer — they will send one free! **DO NOT** sell a seat without its instruction booklet.

2. Is this seat more than 6 years old? The date of manufacture can be found on the label, usually in **ddmmyy** format. Some seats have an expiration date stamped into the plastic shell. Most manufacturers advise not using a seat if more than 6 years old. For questions, call the manufacturer.

3. Has this seat ever been involved in a crash? The original owner should be able to give an accurate history on the seat. **DO NOT** sell a seat that has been in a crash — undetectable hairline cracks can compromise the ability of the seat to protect a child in a crash.

4. Has this seat been recalled? A current recall list is posted at www.safeguiford.org/recalls or call 336.832.2970. To check recall status, you need the manufacturer, model number and date of manufacture (see top of this form). If a recalled seat has been repaired ask for proof. **DO NOT** sell a seat that has been recalled and not repaired.
